Each week has a different theme, which instructors use as the focus for their projects and activities. Children registered for multiple weeks like the variety of having something new to look forward to with each one. Grouped by age in an informal and nurturing setting, children delight in making new friends and trying new activities. The student to teacher ratio for Multi-Arts Mornings is 5:1.
